GAZA CEASEFIRE PILGRIMAGE

When: Sunday, April 28th at 1:00 PM Where: North Commons at Creighton Fields Gate, across from the corner of North Park and Nora Bernard Streets. (Former Cornwallis Street)

Join us for a prayerful walk to call for a just peace. Our goal is to have 30 people walk/roll around the perimeter of the Commons 3 times - which would equal the length of the Gaza Strip.

The Commons was chosen because there is good visibility with streets on all sides and yet we don't need to cross any streets. We will take/send a photo of our group to Ottawa where it will be part of a display of people of faith across the country calling for a just peace.

We will ask our MP and the government of Canada to support our Calls for:

- An enduring and Sustained Ceasefire.
- The immediate flow of life saving food, water, aid, fuel and humanitarian assistance.
- The release of all hostages both the Israeli hostages held by Hamas and the Palestinian hostages held in the Israeli prison system.
- The end of occupation so a just-peace can begin.
- We will pray for a just peace at the beginning, along the way, and at the end of our day's pilgrimage.
- We are walking and praying in solidarity with those who have been suffering in many ways and whose lives are at risk now in Gaza.
- Please join the Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage in Halifax.
- Please invite others in your community to join the Pilgrimage.
